**Eyewitness Accounts from the Ground via Text Message and Email:**

**Saturday, September 26, 2009** - "Just saw rescuers load bodies in a van, more buried in mud in Bagong Silang, worst hit area in Quezon City in Metro Manila's worst flood in 40 years per media received. Report no casualty among 300 families in GK Brookside, none in 1000 families of GK Sito Ruby though casualties outside. In Bagong Barrio, none in 84 GK sites in entire Quezon City. Our sites have become relief centers with help from LGU, CFC caretakers and partners, but real heroes are GK KBS in GK Brookside. They did 7 heroic rescue of hundreds of children and moms via rooftops of GK Homes."

**Sunday, September 27, 2009** - "Generally, after rounds made in GK sites in Quezon City, our Kapitbahayans' homes are intact except for one which sustained minor structural damages due to a wall that gave way. The damages to our sites are caused by the major flooding, hence what our residents are experiencing now are damages to property (furniture and appliances), clothes, food and some physical and psychological trauma. Our GK villages are likewise being mobilized to be relief centers to surrounding slum areas."
